

Training Resources for the Implementation of Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)

Below are suggested online and face-to-face training options for individual providers and organizations interested in implementing SBIRT with young people. These trainings include an introduction to evidence-based screening tools and instruction in <u>motivational interviewing</u> – the core strategy used with the SBIRT approach. Several of these trainings also provide implementation coaching and support.

Online Training Options

Introduction to SBIRT for Adolescents

Provided by:	Institute for Research, Education and Training in Addictions (IRETA)
Format:	Interactive self-paced modules, including videos and quizzes.
Content:	Provides practitioners with the skills necessary to identify and address the needs of young individuals using alcohol or other drugs in a risky manner.
Cost:	Free

SBIRT Core Training Activity

Provided by:	Clinical Tools, Inc. Addiction Training Group	
Format:	Four interactive modules, including three simulated cases and quizzes.	
Content:	The course addresses how brief and effective screening for substance use problems can improve patient outcomes and offers strategies for planning and arranging substance use disorder treatment referral.	
Cost:	\$50 per person. Group rates available.	
Screening and Brief Intervention Skills Practice & Assessment

Format:	Conversation Simulation	
Content:	Prepares health professionals to screen young patients for substance use, conduct brief interventions using evidence-based principles of motivational interviewing, and, when necessary, refer patients to further support.

SBIRT Oregon Training Curriculum		

Provided by: Oregon's SAMHSA-funded SBIRT initiative, located at the Department of Family Medicine, Oregon Health and Science University

Format: Contains twelve modules that include videos and downloadable role-play exercises.

SBIRT 101 Webinars

Provided by: Institute for Research, Education and Training in Addictions (IRETA)

Format: Self-paced online course comprised of three webinars.

- Content: This is an introductory course designed to give participants an understanding of SBIRT and its components. The three sections of this course include: Introduction to SBIRT and Guide to Screening; Overview of Motivational Interviewing as Used in Brief Interventions; and Referral to Treatment for Drug and Alcohol.
- Cost: Free

Face-to-Face Training

IRETA's Customized In-Person SBIRT Training

Provided by: Institute for Research, Education and Training in Addictions (IRETA)

- Content: IRETA offers a variety of trainings that can equip organizations to plan and implement SBIRT with young people. Specific training content is customized to the organization's needs.

MASBIRT Training for Individuals and Organizations

- Provided by: Massachusetts Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment Training and Technical Assistance (MASBIRT)
- Content: Includes skill-building for providers and technical assistance and consultation to organizations interested in incorporating SBIRT services. Specific training content is customized to the organization's needs.
- Cost: MASBIRT provides training to some Massachusetts providers through a contract with the Massachusetts Bureau of Substance Abuse Services. MASBIRT also offers trainings to other organizations in and outside of Massachusetts for a fee.

BNI-ART SBIRT Training and Consultation

Provided by: BNI-ART Institute at Boston University School of Public Health

- Content: Trainings range from brief, introductory lectures on SBIRT to intensive, multiday courses that include supervised practice with real patients. The trainings differ in their length and material to best match the organization's needs.
- Cost: \$300 for introductory lecture, \$1,500 for 4-hour workshop, and \$750 per person for 2-day intensive practitioner training.

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
