## Oral Health Data Cheat Sheet

This resource provides information on oral health data and sources that advocates commonly find helpful in describing access to care barriers, oral health problems, and disparities. These data are also useful for making the case for policy solutions that address these issues. You may also wish to reach out to your state’s office of oral health as they may be able to direct you to state-specific publications or data.

<b>Access &amp; Outcomes</b>	Adult Yearly Dental Visit	<a href="#">CDC</a>	The % of adults who have had a dental visit in the past year. Broken down by age, education, income, and race.
	Emergency Room Usage for Dental Conditions	<a href="#">ADA</a>	This resource provides national data from the ADA, but there is no central source for state data on this topic. However, many states track and/or publish data.  You may also be able to make a request for Medicaid data from your state (we can guide you on exactly what to ask for if desired).
	National Oral Health Data	<a href="#">NIDCR</a>	This resource breaks down specific oral health issues by topic and age group.

<b>Medicaid</b>	Medicaid Adult Dental Benefits	<a href="#">CareQuest</a>	Track the Medicaid adult dental benefits by state.
	Children with Medicaid Coverage Utilization	<a href="#">CMS</a>	This data reports the number of children who utilized certain services annually. To learn how to use the data, see this <a href="#">resource</a> .
	Dentist Participation in Medicaid	<a href="#">ADAHPI</a>	This report tracks the percentage of dentists who accept Medicaid coverage by state.  Note that this data tracks the number of dentists enrolled in Medicaid, not the number actually treating Medicaid patients or accepting new Medicaid patients (many states have found significant gaps between those numbers)
<b>Special Populations</b>	Children’s Access to Dental Care Data and Children’s Oral Health Outcomes Data	<a href="#">NSCH</a>	Collection of data on children’s health, including oral health from all 50 states. The interactive data tool includes several dental access measures.
	Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring System	<a href="#">PRAMS</a>	Provides data on number of pregnancy health indicators, including access to oral health care during pregnancy.
	Senior Tooth Loss	<a href="#">CDC</a>	The CDC tracks the percent of older adults who have lost multiple teeth or all their teeth due to dental disease by education, gender, income, and race.

ADA Health Policy Institute Research Brief (2016)	<a href="#">ADAHPI</a>	This brief looks at use of dental services among children and adults and includes several key data points about dental visits, different populations who are uninsured or publicly insured.
Center for Health Care Strategies Data Brief (2017)	<a href="#">CHCS</a>	This brief examines use of dental services among low-income adults with Medicaid coverage.
Centers for Disease Control (CDC)	<a href="#">CDC</a>	This resource offers basic data points on access to care and oral health for children, adults, and older adults, as well as data on oral health disparities.
